91st Annual American Legion Auxiliary Convention
PROPOSED RULES & ORDER OF BUSINESS

- 1) A quorum shall exist when there are present seven or more districts, wholly or partially represented.
- 2) Convention sessions shall be started promptly at the stated time.
- 3) All delegates must be seated with their districts.
- 4) A delegate desiring recognition shall go to the nearest microphone, address the chair as “Madam President,” and upon receiving recognition from the chair, shall give her name, unit number and district number.
- 5) A speaker shall be permitted to speak not more than twice on any one question; once in presenting the question and once in closing the discussion.
- 6) Before the election, time shall be granted in the regular order of business to nominate the Department Officers.
- 7) Nominations will not be called by roll call of each district. The nominators and the candidates will be called to the stage as a group. Districts with known and endorsed candidates for office will be called in numerical order. Other nominations will be asked for from the floor
- 8) There shall be no seconds to nominations.
- 9) Nomination speeches shall be limited as follows:

a. One (1) candidate for office -	two (2) minute limit
b. Two (2) or more candidates for office -	three (3) minute limit
c. One (1) candidate for Department President -	three (3) minute limit
d. Two (2) or more candidates for Department President -	four (4) minute limit.
- 10) Immediately following her nomination, each nominee shall be presented from the stage and shall be granted one (1) minute for any response or remarks she may wish to make.
- 11) There shall be no nominations speeches for delegates to the National Convention.
- 12) All resolutions shall be referred to the proper committee for study and recommendation and shall be reported back to the convention for adoption or rejection. The resolutions committee shall present all resolutions.
- 13) Chairmen, when giving their Reports, shall address the chair as “Madam President,” shall be allowed three (3) minutes to give their report. Reports may be accepted by general consent of the convention delegates. If there is an objection, a vote will be taken.
- 14) Delegates may leave the convention hall only at the end of a speaker’s report. Upon returning, the delegate will remain at the back of the convention hall until the current speaker has ended.
- 15) Delegates must attend all convention sessions, including the final session.
- 16) Roll call of District delegation will be taken daily by the District President.
- 17) District pages shall be responsible for distributing all convention materials to her District’s delegates.
- 18) Guests shall be honored at the convention by applause only.
- 19) All cell phones will be turned off while Convention is in session.

- Nominations will not be called by roll call of each district.
- Districts with known and endorsed candidates for office will be called in numerical order.
- Other nominations will be asked for from the seated delegates.
- There shall be no seconds to nominations.
- Nomination speeches shall be limited as follows:
 - One (1) candidate for office - two (2) minute limit
 - Two (2) or more candidates for office - three (3) minute limit
 - One (1) candidate for Department President - three (3) minute limit
 - Two (2) or more candidates for Department President - four (4) minute limit.
- Immediately following her nomination, each nominee shall be presented on stage and shall be granted one (1) minute for any response or remarks she may wish to make.

In conformity with Article VI, Section 1 of the National Constitution, which provides that the annual national convention of the American Legion Auxiliary shall be held at the same time and place as The American Legion convention, the 91st National Convention of the American Legion Auxiliary is hereby called to meet in Minneapolis, Minnesota, from August 26 - September 1, 2011. The convention business sessions will be in the Minneapolis Convention Center.

PURPOSE

The annual national convention is the legislative body of the American Legion Auxiliary. The convention is called for the purpose of electing officers for the ensuing year, amending the National Constitution & Bylaws, receiving reports of national officers and committees, and for the transaction of such other business as may be brought before it. Officers for the ensuing year will be elected on August 31, 2011.

REPRESENTATION

Representation in the convention shall be by department and in accordance with the provisions of the National Constitution, Article VI, Section 2.

Each department shall be entitled to five delegates and one additional delegate for each 1,500 members or major fraction thereof, whose current dues have been received by the national treasurer 30 days prior to the meeting of said convention, and to one alternate for each delegate.

In addition to the above, members of the National Executive Committee (including the national president, national vice president, division national vice presidents, Past National Presidents, national chaplain and national historian) are delegates-at-large to the national convention with vote, to be exercised with their departments.

Each delegate shall be entitled to one vote. The vote of any delegates absent and not represented by an alternate shall be cast by the majority of the delegates present from her department.

ALTERNATES

Alternates will have the power to vote only in the absence of the regular delegates.

The selection of alternates to represent absent delegates is a matter for decision by the respective department delegation.

NATIONAL EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

A Pre-Convention Meeting of the 2010-2011 National Executive Committee is hereby called and will be held at 8:00 a.m., Saturday, August 27, 2011, in Room 211, Minneapolis Convention Center, as provided by National Bylaws, Article IV, Section 2.

A Post-Convention Meeting of the 2011-2012 National Executive Committee will be held in Room 103ABC, Minneapolis Convention Center, on Thursday, September 1, 2011 (National Bylaws, Article IV, Section 2).

DEPARTMENT OFFICERS

Department officers, unless elected as delegates or alternates to the national convention, have no privilege in the convention except as guests of their respective delegations.

CONVENTION COMMITTEE MEETINGS

Pre-Convention Committee Meetings will be held on Saturday, August 27, 2011, from 10:00 -11:30 a.m. in the Minneapolis Convention Center. Locations will be provided in your convention program book. Each department shall designate 1 delegate or 1 alternate to a committee meeting and notify her of the time and location. Departments shall file a list of the designees with the national secretary. Any substitution should be filed with the chairman or secretary of the convention committee.

CREDENTIALS

Each delegation secretary shall transmit to National Headquarters no earlier than August 1, 2011, and no later than August 15, 2011, the official Certification of Delegates and Alternates Form and electronic Delegate and Alternate lists. Electronic lists must contain the following information:

1. Name of department.
2. Number of units in the department.
3. Paid-up membership according to the books of the national treasurer on Friday, July 30, 2010, which is 30 days prior to the meeting.
4. Date and place of the department convention at which delegates and alternates were selected.
5. Name of delegation chairman.
6. Name of delegation secretary.
7. Names, complete member numbers, complete addresses and email addresses, and unit affiliations of delegates.
8. Names, complete member numbers, complete addresses and email addresses, and unit affiliations of alternates.
9. Signature of department president, attested by department secretary.

CREDENTIALS FEES

A registration fee of \$15 for each delegate and \$15 for each alternate in attendance must be paid to the national treasurer by the delegation secretary no earlier than August 1, 2011, and no later than August 15, 2011.

SECURING CREDENTIALS IN MINNEAPOLIS, MINNESOTA

Delegation secretaries can secure credentials August 25 and 26, 2011, in Room 208, Minneapolis Convention Center.

DELEGATION HEADQUARTERS

Each department delegation will establish headquarters in the hotel to which assigned. Upon arrival in Convention City, all members of department delegations will report to their delegation headquarters. They will receive all necessary instructions from the secretary of their delegation.

ADMISSION TO CONVENTION SESSIONS

Admission to convention sessions will be by delegate, alternate, or guest badge. All visitors who wish to attend convention sessions must register with The American Legion.

NATIONAL HEADQUARTERS OFFICE

The American Legion Auxiliary National Headquarters Convention Office will be in Room 208, Minneapolis Convention Center, August 24 – September 1, 2011.

Membership Renewal

Tonight while driving home from work, I saw a bumper sticker which read “*Protect those who Protect Us*”. I think this says it all. Soldiers being deployed are now serving their second and third tours in battle zones in Iraq and Afghanistan. Our military men and women serving abroad can concentrate more on their duties if they know we are taking care of them and their families at home.

On behalf of the American Legion Auxiliary, I am asking you to continue being a member of the largest women’s patriotic organization in the world. We all joined the American Legion Family for a reason. Have things changed? Do you choose not to renew for a reason? Have your interests changed? Or the Auxiliary doesn’t offer anything for you anymore. Is it an oversight?

You do not have to be an active member at your local Unit. But to think your membership is not important is not correct. Why should you continue your membership you may ask? It is very simple; the American Legion Auxiliary has been and still is an advocate for veterans and their families.

On the veterans front there have been years and years of the Government chipping away at Veteran Benefits. The American Legion Family is on the front line fighting to keep benefits for those who have honorably served their country in the military.

You may think that I am overstating the importance of your membership, but I ask you to consider the following. We live in a time when our Supreme Court has ruled that the desecration of our Flag is protected free speech. Tell that to those valiant troops that raised the flag over Iwo Jima in World War II! Did you know that the American Legion Auxiliary, through the Citizens Flag Alliance, is the biggest proponent for a constitutional amendment to protect our flag as a sacred emblem of our nation?

There are over 1.2 million women veterans in America today. It is up to us to continue to speak up for the benefits that they deserve. Without our help, women veterans in our communities may not find the assistance they need to deal with sexual trauma, homelessness and post traumatic stress disorder.

The best way to honor your veteran, who gave you the eligibility for membership, is by renewing your membership. The American Legion Auxiliary’s voice is only as large as the numbers we can show in membership. As this country continues the war against terrorism, we see so many of our younger Americans serving to protect the things that our family members served to preserve for them. These young Americans are our new “*Greatest Generation*”.

I hope that you will consider these things and see how important your membership is to the American Legion Auxiliary. Renew and continue your part in the Power of One — your membership Honoring and Caring for Those Who Served.

NEW FOR 2012 MEMBERSHIP

National has instituted a few changes this year of which your Membership Chairman and all members are going to need to be informed of. **PLEASE PASS IT ON.**

- **The number shown in the continuous years star on the members' cards.** In the 2011 Membership Year National implemented new membership processing software. This program only allows for what has already been paid in the system at the time of the printing. Members are used to seeing their continuous years reflecting the dues they are paying at the time. This is not going to be the case anymore. The number on their card, if they have already paid their 2011 dues is going to reflect their years up to that point and will not include their 2012 payment as it has not and could not yet have happened at the time of the printing. National suggests for those members that are bothered by this to white out the preprinted year and the members' actual paid years can be written in.

The members' cards and roster were printed the first week of May. Any member that had not had their dues submitted to Department prior to the printing will not have a number in it. That does not mean Headquarters stopped processing or that they have lost their continuous years, again payment was not received in time to reflect the number in the star.

- **National will not be accepting anymore NEW 2011 members after August 31st.** Any new members submitted after then will automatically be put in as New for 2012. Also any NEW 2012 members will not be entered until after September 1st. **2012 renewals may be submitted at anytime.**
- **National is changing the ways they determine the Units goals for the year.** The goals for 2012 will be based off of total 2011 membership paid as of July 31st 2011. This has nothing to do with the amount of members on their rosters but is based solely on the Unit's paid membership. All Districts and Units will receive their goals once they have been passed onto us from National.
- **Online Membership Processing.** In an e-mail sent to Department from National on May 25th 2011 they had this to say about online membership processing " ..when we are able to offer the ability for members to pay dues online. We are only in the planning stages now and **anticipate it will be several years before this will be available.**"

2012 Membership Materials distributed from Department Headquarters

This year the membership packets are going to go out in two separate mailings. The first mailing is identical to the packet you just received. This went out bulk mail Thursday June 2nd. Please note bulk mail can take anywhere from 7-14 days. The second mailing will go first class around June 10th or the 13th. This packet will contain the Unit rosters and membership cards. Back in April a 2012 Unit Dues Information sheet was sent to each Unit President asking them to provide Department and National of the name and address of the person they would like to receive the membership materials and to be printed on the first set of renewal notices. The person listed on that returned form is the person the 2012 membership packets were sent to. By the end of June every Unit should have their 2012 membership materials. If they do not, they need to contact Headquarters ASAP.

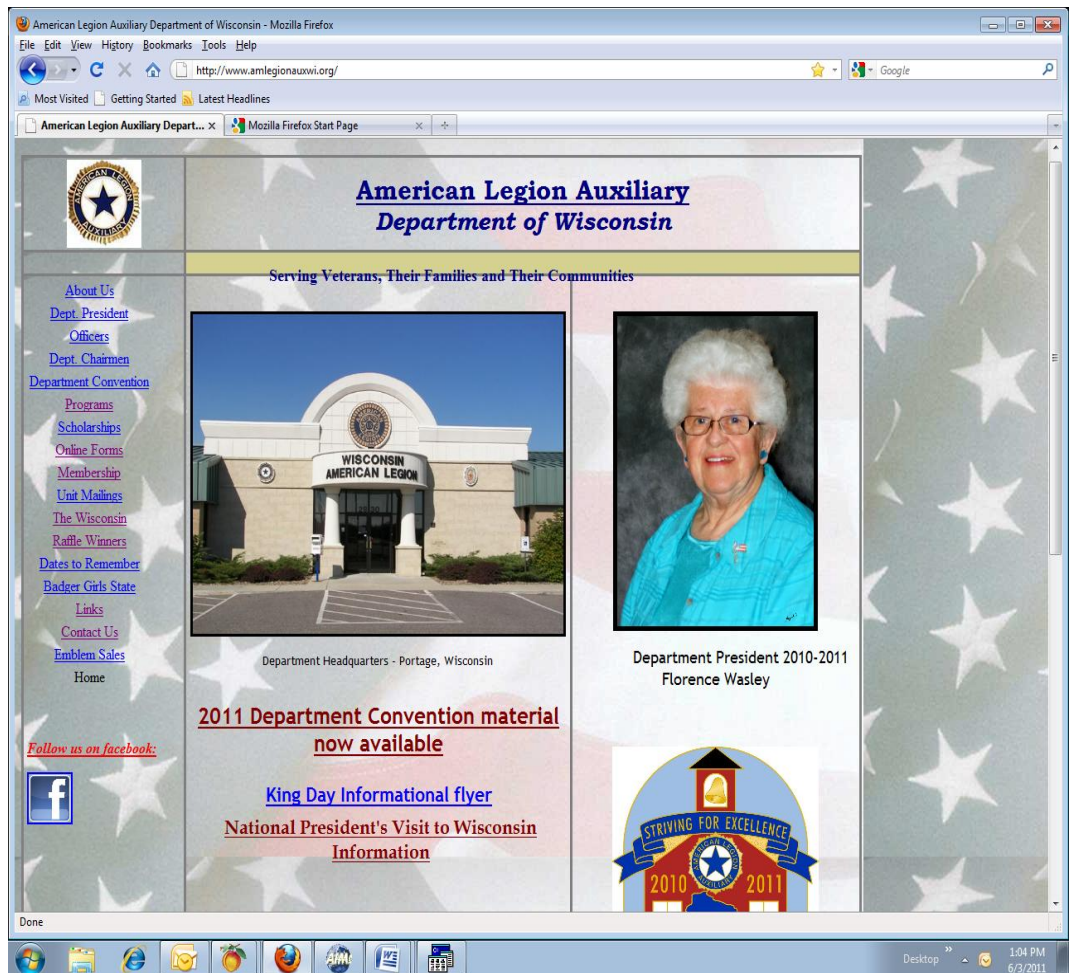
