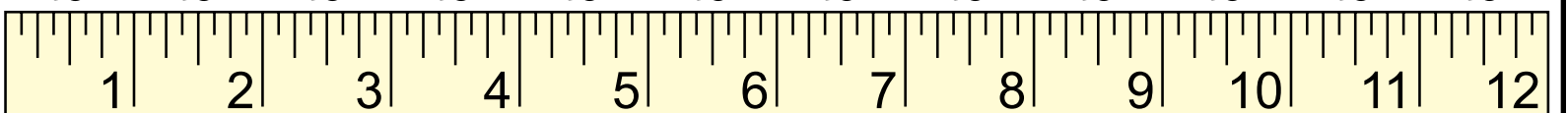

other war torn areas by sending creature comforts that are not otherwise available to them including quilts, phone cards, stamps and snacks. We are helping the spouses and kids with hero backpacks and other items to help them adjust at home while a parent is fighting for us. We try to acknowledge all of them in any way we can. We help to make the transition into and out of the military as painless as possible. We can never do enough to take the place of a missing parent.

But what about those who have given their lives for us – do we acknowledge the transition that their families must make? The lives of families and communities are affected each time a life is taken on foreign soil but many of us know so little about the routine that is followed at Dover Air Force Base in Delaware each time the remains of a fallen military hero is returned to the United States. This is an important part of our education as American Legion Auxiliary members and is one of the greatest Americanism ex-

amples we have. Every day is Memorial Day at Dover Air Force Base where the remains of all the deceased are returned to be claimed by their loved ones. Each one's remains are handled exactly the same regardless of rank – they are treated with the care, love and respect that they deserve as protectors of our freedoms. This affects all of our lives as we are all part of one large worldly community and need the support of one another. To read more about the solemnity of the entire process go to the Dover Air Force Base website and read about it in detail.

Being an American is a privilege and needs our support and calls for involvement every single day. There are many who await the opportunity to take our American rights and privileges away from us and we need to be constantly on the alert for the insidious ways in which this is being done. Spread the word whenever you hear of any individual or group trying to take these rights and privileges away from us.

The unit and school mailings have been sent out for the June 19-24 sixty-eighth session of Wisconsin American Legion Auxiliary Badger Girls State to be held at Gruenhagen Conference Center on the University of Oshkosh campus in Oshkosh, Wisconsin. The delegate fee remains at \$240 for each delegate. Usually an American Legion Auxiliary unit is the sponsor for the delegate. In the case of no auxiliary unit the local American Legion Post may sponsor a delegate. Often the sponsor will ask other community groups such as the Kiwanis, Rotary, Optimists,

Retired Teachers Groups, etc. to be a contributor and help to pay the fee for the delegate. It is very important that the sponsor notify the local high school of the number of delegates they will sponsor. Hopefully the sponsoring units keep in close contact with the high school and maybe are even involved in the selection of the delegate or delegates.

The Badger Girls State website at www.badgergirlsstate.org will be filled with information regarding orientations that the delegates attend prior to the session in order to be well-prepared for the mock government activities at the city, county and state levels. Descriptions of the various interest groups as well as information for parents of delegates will be found on the

website. Upon completing online registration the delegates will be able to download their health form, Badger Girls State Pledge form and Publicity Release form from the website. These three forms need to be turned in at registration on Sunday, June 19.

It is critical for the high school to choose an alternate for each delegate to be sure that the \$240 fee is not lost by the sponsoring unit. Sponsors do opt to have their fee transferred to another delegate or put in the Badger Girls State fund. It is therefore most important that the sponsor keep in touch with the high school and the delegate up through the time of the session. After the session is over be sure to invite the delegate to speak to your groups.

Those who read the mailing that came out in early Fall, or attended my workshop at the Informational forum, have heard this plea before. Is there no one in our Department Auxiliary who fits the qualifications for this appointment and is willing to do this service for those who did so much for us?

If you are not sure who your representative is or how to contact him/her you can go to www.Legion.org/Legislative. Scroll down until you see "write to Congress" and type in your zip code number. Information on Wisconsin legislators can be found at www.WisconsinLegislature.gov. If you do not have a computer or are only semi computer literate like me, your local newspaper office will be happy to furnish you with this information. Good luck.
