

District 3 Poppy Chairperson Report- 4/2024

Poppies are a year round project. The needs of our veterans and their families are year round though we put special emphasis on National Poppy Day , May 24th and Memorial Day. WE must remind people to wear red and wear a poppy.

As members of the American Legion Auxiliary, we all accepted this responsibility of promoting and preserving the poppy program. We must encourage people to participate in he Poppy program. Share the Poppy Color Story!! Put an article in your local paper, on social media, put an article in your newsletter and add an envelope with history of poppy in it, a poppy so they can mail back to the chair with their donation. Possibly have a direct deposit, share this information in your newsletter.

Assemble containers and put in local businesses during the month of May. I have one business that keeps it there all year.

During the month of May have a distribution date set and a location site. Have a least two people at the location and provide contact information to all volunteers. Wear auxiliary logo apparel. Consider promotion tools such as flyers- how the money raised by the unit has helped veterans, posters or buttons. Invite local servicemembers to help in your distribution or display uniforms, boots, etc.

Encourage Legionnaires to join you for Poppy Days and ask them to wear their Legion caps. Work with your Public Relations Chair to help prepare a news release announcing Poppy Day and Program Fact sheet.

A Poppy Day Proclamation, news release template and samples are available through National Headquarters or online at www.ALAforVeterans.org

Promote the Poppy Poster Contest in local schools. These can be anytime of the year. Those who participate, along with their parents, will in turn spread the word about the program. Use some of these posters as advertisement in local stores by hanging a color copy. There are ALA poppy coloring books available which is a great way to educate ids about the meaning behind the poppy. They can be downloaded for free from www.ALAforVeterans.org.

We cannot let our Veterans and their families down. They gave us freedom and justice for all, so wear your red, take your poppies and greet your public with smiles, smiles, smiles.

- Education on Financial Literacy and Career Readiness Support for Military Families


