

Through the Children and Youth program, the American Legion Auxiliary protects, cares for and supports our children and youth, particularly those of military families. How we accomplish this can be through some of the available books, pictures for them to color and can also be educated on patriotism, Americanism and the constitution of the United States through "Star Spangled Kids."

Children of active duty service members are supported through "Kids are Heroes 2" and Josh Dogs. Children are given special awards for performing "Good Deeds" and for being "Youth Heroes."

The C&Y program was set up to help maintain a "whole" child program, with regard for all needs of children physical, spiritual, emotional and educational. One of the ways this is accomplished is through preserving the family home. There are other organizations and agencies for children for us to work with and assist. Examples would be the big Brothers Big Sisters program or Special Olympics events.

Education of our membership and the general public on the needs of children and ways of meeting those needs. We support legislation for children through resolutions adopted by national and state American Legion governing bodies along with our local governments.
