Each year in December, thousands of volunteers come together to honor those who've served by laying wreaths at veterans' graves. This year, Wreaths Across America will take place on Saturday, December 13, with more than 4,225 locations participating across all 50 states, at sea, and overseas.

Many of our American Legion Family members are part of this meaningful tradition. Last year, thanks in part to their efforts, over 3 million wreaths were placed nationwide – a truly remarkable show of gratitude.

If you've never taken part, I encourage you to give it a try. It's a powerful experience. If you're unable to volunteer in person, you can still contribute by sponsoring a wreath through your local American Legion Unit, Post, or Squadron – or by visiting: wreathsacrossamerica.org.

American Legion Family USA 250 Challenge

According to the Legion website, The American Legion Family is honoring the nation's 250th birthday with a commitment to embracing physical activity, supporting mental health and serving it's communities. The USA 250 Challenge encourages American Legin Family members, other veterans and all Americans to participate, and even raise additional money to support our disabled veterans and families in need through The American Legion Veterans & Children Foundation.

The year-long initiative offers three categories – fitness, mental wellness and community service – in order to engage more American Legion Family members and others to participate.

You may engage in one, two or all three activities as an individual or as part of a team like a Post, Unit, Squadron or Riders chapter.

The registration fee is \$30.00 and each participant will receive their choice of a USA 250 Challenge tech shirt. Donations will go to the Veterans and Children Foundation.

Ideas for things to do in the three categories are

- **Fitness** cover 250 miles (or hours) of any fitness activities you choose. Examples for individuals include walking, hiking, running, cycling, swimming, using the elliptical, playing pickleball, rowing, etc. Participants may also join a group effort to achieve the goal. Example 10 teammates walking an average of 25 miles each.
- **Wellness** complete 250 hours of wellness activities. Examples for individuals include yoga, mediation and other forms of mindfulness.
- **Community Service** complete 250 hours of community service. Examples cleaning up 250 graves in a veterans cemetery, teaching flag etiquette to 250 students, sending 250 care packages to deployed troops.

Membership

REMINDER - County Presidents contact your Units and Unit Presidents contact your members to keep the membership numbers rolling.

This year's membership theme is "National Park Service".

The 2nd District's National Park is **Denali.** Membership will be calculated for each Unit, County and District.


Units can begin having their members pay their 2026 membership dues. Dues can either be paid over the phone by calling National direct @ 317-569-4570 (Mon.-Fri. 7:00 a.m.-3:30 p.m.), online by logging on to the National website at www.ALAforVeterans.org, or they can pay their membership chairperson at their Unit.

Encourage early payment of membership dues to be eligible for a Unit "Navigation/Compass" Award. Membership dues must be at Department Headquarters PRIOR to the goal date to be considered eligible and the Unit must have the 2025-2026 Unit Officer Form submitted to Department with officers' dues paid to be eligible. One Unit will be awarded \$100.00.

75% is paid by September 15, 2025 – winner Berlin Unit #340, District 6 85% is paid by October 15, 2025 – winner Coleman Unit #280, District 9 95% is paid by November 15, 2025 – winner DeForest Unit #348, District 3 100% is paid by December 15, 2025.

There is also a "Park Pass" Award. If a Unit has 100% membership dues to Department Headquarters PRIOR to December 31, 2025, you will receive 2 entries per Unit or January 31, 2026, you will receive 1 entry per Unit. The Unit must also have their 2025-2026 Unit Officer from on file at Department Headquarters. The "Park Pass" Award will be one winner, selected at random on February 14, 2026, to receive:

- Two Paid Department Convention registrations
- One paid room for a 2-night stay at the Hilton Appleton Paper Valley Hotel
- Two passes for Saturday night's (July 18, 2026) Commander's party
- Special Convention recognition.
