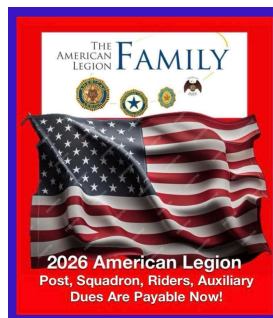

With the knowledge that you will learn during this workshop, we are hoping that we can bring that stress level down to the point that you will no longer despise your duty to report on the activities in which you participate. This does not only apply to the president or the program chair—but also to each individual member. Therefore, we want to fill the room with ALL members! Look for more information on this workshop in the near future! The Department of Wisconsin Legislative Chairman Becky Mueller has issued a Legislative 250 Challenge. The challenge is for all Districts to report how many elected officials they have contacted from October 2025 to June 2026.

With the goal of reaching 250 by the end of the “Challenge”. The districts with the most contacts will be acknowledged at State Convention. The first quarter (Oct.- Dec.) the 10th District reported 125 contacts. The 250 Challenge is to bring awareness to any pending legislature that could impact the military or veterans. Also to be in contact with elected officials concerning important matters from the local to national levels.

What is a considered a contact to an elected official?

Legion Action Alerts – I Alert completed = 1 contact

Written letters

Emails sent

Phone calls

Online surveys

Town halls

Office visits

***Always be respectful when contacting an elected official.**

Report the number of contacts made:

Keep a personal log of the number of contacts you made from January – March. Report these numbers by April 10th to your unit or County President. You can also send your contact numbers directly to me. Include your Unit name/number.

SERVICE TO VETERANS

The weather right now brings to mind the song “Baby It's Cold Outside”. As I am writing this, the wind is really howling out there; and this weekend, it sounds like it is going to be brutal wind chills! I am thankful that we are blessed to have warm houses to protect us from the treacherous elements, and pray that anyone who does need to be outside will be able to bundle up adequately to stay safe. Weather like this does make me pause, though, and take stock of the fact that many of us are not as blessed—even people who we may know. Please take the time to check on each other! Make sure those whom you know, whether it be close friend or a new acquaintance, are also safe, warm and with food in their kitchen.

The Community Cupboard, Augusta's food pantry, was open last night—and I saw many cars parked outside the building, each one waiting their turn to go inside and receive some much-needed food to help supplement what they are able to provide to their families. I think of others, like our homeless neighbors, especially our homeless veterans, who need shelter—a bed, clothing, a hot meal and most of all dignity, as they navigate the situation in which they currently find themselves. This is an area that is so near and dear to my heart; because, as my husband, Ken Piel, asked his fellow veterans when he founded Helping Hands for Veterans: “What does a homeless veteran look like?” Then he would hold up a small mirror, and ask them to each look at themselves in that mirror; while they did this, he would say, “But by the grace of God, this is what a homeless veteran looks like.” Ken was right! Except by the grace and blessings of God, we could all be in situations beyond our control. This is one of the reasons that American Legion Auxiliary, along with the rest of the American Legion family, have programs to address these situations. For our veterans who are in need, we have our Veterans Affairs and Rehabilitation (VA&R) program. As the Department Chair of the Service to Veterans program, which is a program under VA&R, I would like to share this information with you. The statistics are staggering.

- America's homeless veterans have served in every war since World War II.
- About 1.4 million other veterans are considered at risk of homelessness due to poverty, lack of support networks, and dismal living conditions in overcrowded or substandard housing.
- Nearly half of homeless veterans served during the Vietnam era. Two-thirds served our country for at least three years, and one-third were stationed in a war zone.

Teen workers, Acacia Kunkel, Bella Rose, Anna Rose, Freya Fenstermacher, Ireland Meyer, Lainey Dombrovski, Tori Manikowski, Ruth Eby and Leda Hedin saved a Restaurant (Urban, Olive and Vine) in Hudson, WI while the owner spent months in the hospital with his wife. These teens not only rallied to save the Cafe, but its owner as well. Both Chad Trainor and his wife built their business with teen employees. On September 28, 2024, Carol Trainor collapsed on the floor and had a grand mal seizure. She spent the next eight months in the hospital in a coma with Chad by her side. Not once did Chad ask these teens to do anything extra. They just did it! The teens essentially ran the place. They were opening the Cafe in the mornings, ordering supplies, managing finances, training each other, came up with daily specials, and kept Carol's plants alive. They were covering things that needed to be covered - till Carol came back. Carol did not come back! She died in May, 2025.
