Awards at Spring Conference

Educator of the Year – Kathy Williams

Nominated by DeForest Post 348,

EMT of the Year - Katrina McKee

Our EMT of the Year has served since October of 2015. Her Chief wrote that "Since the start of her service she has gone above and beyond in every way to help us serve our communities. Her professionalism, eagerness to teach, and running calls has moved our service forward, and has been monumental in getting us where we are today.

May Day Greetings,

The 2025 Third District's Spring Conference was held on Saturday, April 26th in Monroe with 55 attendees. We were honored to have Department Senior-Vice President Sue Hembrook deliver greetings on behalf of Department President Becky Mueller. The guest speaker was Jodi Barnett, Women Veterans Coordinator with the WI Department of Veterans Affairs. Jodi spoke of the challenges women veterans experience and the support available to them. District Commander Dan O'Brien gave a supportive message on how to keep the Legion Family strong.

The Pulvermacher-Ryan/Endres Leadership Award was awarded to three recipients, Cathy Wilson-Eyre from Madison Unit 481, Sheila Melby from Richland Center Unit 13 and Suzi Mickelson from Mazomanie Unit 437. The traveling Silver Tea Service was presented to Madison Unit 481, the Harriet Hess Bell was presented to Stoughton Unit 59 and the Gravel to Cassville e-Unit 352. 14 Units were awarded certificates for achieving 100% membership; in fact, Third District is at 91% of reaching their goal of 2,490 members.

Michelle Lawn a member of the e-Unit 352 Cassville, made the motion that Dr. Christine Johnsen a member of e-Unit 352 be endorsed by the Third District for Department Historian. Members of the Third District expressed their words of congratulations and support to Christine.

\$970 funds raised from the gift basket raffle and 50/50 were donated to the Department's Homeless Female Veterans Grant Fund.

The conference was a success due to the creative executive committee members of the Third District, Auxiliary members of Unit 84 Monroe, Unit 141 New Glarus, Unit 144 Albany and; the Legion Post 84 Monroe who provided the sound system, assisted with room set-up and provided a delicious lunch.

As of this publishing date, not all "Unit Year-End Impact Numbers Report" have been submitted but the numbers so far are impressive; 32,185 hours members volunteered to veterans/military service and \$45,449 dollars spent in service to veterans and military; \$23,628 dollars raised from poppies and \$9,400 in scholarships to be awarded to 25 students. Always remember the first words in the Auxiliary's Mission Statement "In the spirit of Service, not self".
