### HIGHLIGHT OUR HERO'S

**Name:** Herbert Tschumperlin  
**Branch of Office:** Army  
**Rank:** Specialist Third Class (SPC 3)  
**Places Served:** England

**Legion Post:** Plum City Post 365  
**Time Served:** 2 years  
**Military Occupation:** Vietnam

Herbert Tschumperlin served in the United States Army for two years, achieving the rank of Specialist Third Class (SPC 3). Volunteering to serve his country, Herbert answered the call to duty with commitment and dedication. During his time in the Army, Herbert was stationed in England. While there, he recalls a period when an airstrip was being rebuilt to accommodate larger aircraft, including B-52 bombers. Although he did not directly participate in the reconstruction and did not see its completion before his departure, he remembers the significance of the project and the evolving needs of military aviation at the time.

Herbert's role involved training and preparation to defend against aerial threats. He describes training with his weapon that was designed to track and engage on remote-controlled or radio-controlled target planes. The equipment he operated on was substantial—a large, wheeled gun weighing several tons. It was equipped with advanced technology for its time, including radar and a computer system capable of locking onto a target aircraft prior to firing. This training ensured that he was ready to respond effectively if called upon. Through his service, Herbert contributed to the readiness and strength of the United States military during a critical time. His willingness to volunteer and his commitment to mastering complex equipment reflect the dedication and quiet professionalism of those who serve.

We are honored to recognize Herbert Tschumperlin and thank him for his service to our country.

Six female Vets (active duty members also welcome) of all fishing experience levels and all physical abilities will enjoy an all-expenses-paid 5-day/4-night fly-fishing trip.

Our program is offered at absolutely no cost. With the help of donors, Northwestern Wisconsin will host ROR trips including lodging, guides, and equipment on the world-renowned Namekagon and St. Croix National Scenic Riverway with all all female veteran staff. ROR is seeking donors to help cover these costs.

On each trip, the women ROR staff, volunteers, and fishing guides have one priority: maximizing the enjoyment of our participants. The program is low-impact and requires very little walking. ROR was founded on the belief that outdoor adventure and sharing good company with other veterans is great medicine. We believe, and are proving, that our unique combination of magnificent scenery, expert staff, established relaxation techniques—and of course spectacular outdoor activities like fly fishing—brings long-lasting, positive effects. The trips are very informal and feel more like a reunion with good friends than a therapy session.



Our goal is to empower women veterans to live a life free from the restrictions of psychological or physical disabilities, and take a leadership role in addressing the needs of our nation's wounded warriors by finding positive treatments for their physical and mental well-being.
