The Legislative program is one of the most effective ways for our Auxiliary to advocate for our veterans and military; and thus, their families and our communities. We can make sure our voice is heard on so many levels, local, county, state and national by sending letters and/or emails calling their offices, or visiting in person at their local offices.

Each member has the privilege and the right to contact their elected officials and ask questions, express concerns and hold them accountable. Some easy ways are to subscribe to their email newsletters, answer their surveys and attend town hall meetings. If visiting the Capital – stop in! Your presence is sure to make an impression

Start by requesting a Blue Book from your local representative – either via phone call or email. Published biennially, the *Wisconsin Blue Book* is a valuable source for information about the State of Wisconsin. First published in 1853 as a manual for legislators, the *Blue Book* has evolved into a useful tool for the state's residents, as well as a historical record of Wisconsin state government. The *Blue Book*'s mission is to furnish the legislature and the public with information on state officers and governmental organization, along with statistical information and articles of general interest.

The newest edition is almost ready for distribution. They are FREE for the asking. Get an extra copy for your unit's use. This reference has vital information to make us more effective advocates, keeps us informed of past and current legislation and processes and has all the updated contact information for both officials and government agencies. Our tax dollars pays for this publication, and it is up to us to make use of it. An excellent resource. Don't forget to sign up for the American Legion Action Center at wilegion.org which has a link toward the bottom of the page called Legislative Call-to-Action. This site makes it easy to send emails to all your federal legislators concerning the top priorities of American Legion Committees. Make your voice heard – just remember that while we are politically active, we, as an organization remain non-partisan.
