**2024 POPPY ORDERS**: The deadline for placing Poppy Orders is December 15<sup>th</sup>. If you need poppies, please order ASAP as last year we ran out of poppies and could not fill all of the requests. Units and posts are reminded they must submit a 20% poppy profit report from their last order before their new order will be processed. Poppy orders will be filled and shipped as soon as possible after they are received. Please verify the accuracy of your shipment *upon receipt*. Units planning to sponsor girls should submit their reservation fees by January 31, 2024 and start working with their schools to select delegate(s). After Department receives the reservation fees, the schools will be notified as to how many delegates they may select so their students can register for the ALABGS session by the April 1<sup>st</sup> deadline. If a delegate is not selected, the unit may request a full refund by emailing Carrie Thrasher no later than April 15, 2024. After April 15<sup>th</sup>, a \$50 processing fee will be deducted from the refund. No refunds will be issued after May 1, 2024.

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One of the questions I get asked by Units sending a delegate to ALABGS is "How can we help them?"

The simplest way you can help them is to save up change to give to them for the Penny War Competition. All proceeds go to the ALABGS Scholarship. Every delegate who completes the program is eligible to apply for the scholarship.



# The Rules of Penny Wars at ALABGS:

- 1. Pennies are positive- so delegates should put pennies in their county's bucket.
- 2. Silver/Paper are negative- so delegates should put silver/paper in OTHER county's buckets.
- 3. Whoever has the most points gets prime location seating at our Inaugural- a highly coveted prize.

# So How Can the Unit help?

- 1. Collect change at your unit meetings (especially pennies!) and ask your Post to do the same at Legion meetings. If you start now, you should have at least a small amount by June.
- 2. Make sure the change then gets put in wrappers (our office ladies will thank you as we have to roll them before we take them to the bank)
- 3. Gift the wrapped coins to your delegate before they come to ALABGS and explain it's for the Penny Wars.





# **Auxiliary Emergency Fund**

The Auxiliary Emergency Fund (AEF) is a fund that provides temporary emergency assistance to eligible American Legion Auxiliary members who have endured a significant financial setback as a result of an act of nature or another personal crisis.

The applicant must be an American Legion Auxiliary (ALA) member. Applicant must have maintained ALA membership for three consecutive years (the current year and immediate past two years). Application must be received within 6 months of disaster. One grant per grantee in a 12-month period will be awarded.

An Auxiliary Emergency Fund grant may provide immediate emergency assistance to American Legion Auxiliary members in areas devastated by a natural disaster, such as fire, flood, hurricane, tornado, earthquake, or other severe weather. The applicant must have received damage to the primary residence and/or been displaced or evacuated from the residence and had out-of-pocket expenses for food, clothing, and shelter. Grants may be awarded up to \$3,000.

Funds requested through AEF related to the payment of medical-related expenses, taxes, general loans, insurances, credit cards, cellular/TV services, animal care, car purchase/payments, and/or home/vehicle maintenance/repairs are not applicable for review or funding consideration.

There are many, many organizations asking for donations and it is important to support the Auxiliary Emergency Fund (AEF). This is <u>direct</u> help from members to members in time of an emergency, for a Disaster Assistance grant or a Temporary Assistance grant. Some suggestions for raising funds are:

- Put raising funds for AEF on your agenda for the upcoming year.
- Challenge members to find fun new fundraising ideas.
- Pass the hat at one or more meetings with funds dedicated to the AEF.
- Have an AEF Chairman in your Unit.

# M. LOUISE WILSON EDUCATIONAL LOAN FUND

The purpose of the M. LOUISE WILSON EDUCATIONAL LOAN FUND is to aid women veterans, and the mothers, wives, daughters, granddaughters, grandmothers, and sisters of honorably discharged veterans to attain a higher education. This is an interest-free loan of \$800.00 which may be applied for annually and can be renewed for up to five years, for a total loan limit of \$4,000.00 to women enrolled in college on a full-time basis.

#### **GENERAL RULES:**

- 1. Applicant must be a resident of the State of Wisconsin and a female member of the American Legion Auxiliary.
  - a. Membership in the American Legion Auxiliary must continue until the loan is paid in full.
  - b. If membership is discontinued, no additional loans will be granted.
- 2. Applicant must be a graduate of an accredited high school with a scholastic average that would place her in the upper half of her class.
- 3. Application must include:
  - a. Copy of the Veteran's DD-214 discharge paper.
  - b. Certified copy of the applicant's school transcript.
  - c. Three letters of personal reference as defined on the application.
- 4. Successive loans may be granted upon approval by the Department Education Chairman, based on evidence of satisfactory grades. When additional loans are granted, the original loan will be cancelled and consolidated with the new loan.
- 5. Student must notify the chair upon graduation or withdrawal from full-time academic status.
- 6. Repayment of new loans originating after August 1, 2016, shall be made in payments of not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) per month, starting within six months after the promissory graduates or ceases to be a full-time academic student.
- 7. The student and loan co-signer are legally responsible to pay the balance of the loan when due, plus any additional costs or legal fees if the loan is in default and referred for collection.

Thanks to the work of **PDP Joan Chwala**, this fund has assisted many ALA members for a number of years. Repayment of loans and donations keeps this fund viable. Education Chairman Diane Weggen is gladly accepting Joan Chwala's assistance.

*Unit Historian:* Your name, Unit # & name and District #.

County Historian: Your name, the name of the County, and District #.

District Historian: Your name & the District #.

I am hoping to see a District history submitted from *every* District. Unit and County histories should be judged at your District Spring Conference, with the first-place winner moving on to Department.

I'll be creating a scrapbook for President Maggie and ask your help to fill it. Newspaper articles, pictures, flyers, etc. (scrapbook-size) will be a great remembrance when she has a minute to catch her breath after a fantastic year! If emailing, send pictures as jpegs for clarity. Snail mail is happily accepted as well!

<u>American Legion Auxiliary Membership Information System</u>

Access to the National Membership database ALAMIS (American Legion Auxiliary Membership Information System) is available to TWO current unit officers/chairmen per unit. Subscription is for read only access to the individual's unit. <u>Two</u> officers/chairmen per unit may register for access but they must have their own individual e-mail address.

The database runs in real time so that you can get the most up to date information. Look up new member ID#'s, view and print current rosters whenever you need to, double check to see who has paid or not paid, and more.

Those more computer savvy will be able to manipulate the information to print mailing labels or send out mass emails. Microsoft Excel is the recommended program to utilize the more advanced capabilities of the system.

Note-This is for read only access; you will not be able to change names, phone numbers, email addresses, drop, decease, or transfer members, etc., all these changes will still need to be submitted to Department Headquarters on a Member Change Form.

Any forms received as of October 1<sup>st</sup> will get the remaining months of 2023 for free.

The subscription fee is \$10.00 per person, per calendar year, January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024 for read only access and each person must be submitted on a separate form.

# POPPY PROGRAM

The poppy is the ALA symbol of sacrifice and remembrance. We remember the soldiers who sacrificed everything so we can live our lives free today. Anytime you wear a poppy, it's an opportunity to start a conversation. We need to educate those who are not aware of what the poppy stands for.

First, we need poppy makers. Encourage veterans to make poppies. Veterans who work through the ALA Poppy Shop at Zablocki get paid for the poppies they make. Everything is provided in a kit that they assemble. Auxiliary members can also

purchase poppy kits from Emblem Sales and make poppies but they can't be identified as veteran-made. We need poppies to distribute! If you need poppies, get your order in by December 15, 2023. Due to a postage increase, if you can arrange to pick up poppies at Midwinter Conference, it would be very helpful.

Sponsor a Poppy Poster contest. There are seven classes from 2<sup>nd</sup> grade to 12<sup>th</sup> grade including a level for special needs. There are criteria that must be followed or the poster may be removed from competition. Poppy Posters are due to this Department Chair by March 15, 2024.

There is also a Best Overall Unit Poppy Program. A typewritten narrative is due by April 1, 2024 and should not exceed 1,000 words.

Next is the Best Poppy Usage contest. If you use your poppies for other than distribution, document how they are being used and submit a report.

The Poppy Revenue award is based on the unit's income revenue in relation to the membership numbers. Make sure you send in the Unit Poppy Profit Report on time.

The Little Miss Poppy nominations are due by March 15<sup>th</sup> but don't wait! She should be keeping a scrapbook of her activities.

It's a ways off but make plans for National Poppy Day May 24, 2024 (always the Friday before Memorial Day). Have your city or village official sign a Poppy Proclamation.

For all of the above, document your activity and take pictures! There are more details in the Program Engagement Plan (formerly Program Action Plan) which will soon be available on the department website (<a href="www.amlegionauxwi.org">www.amlegionauxwi.org</a>), along with other resources to promote the Poppy program. The national website for poppy information is <a href="www.legion-aux.org/poppy">www.legion-aux.org/poppy</a>. Make sure you get your award applications in on time and follow the guidelines. And always wear ALA identification – be it clothing or the badge. Let people know who we are and what we stand for.

We need each unit that distributes poppies to send in their report. Nothing is nicer than getting recognized at the Division and National levels for all the time and energy we spend helping our veterans.

- REPORTING VA&R reports offer an overview of work carried out for our veterans.
   Reporting is mandatory for every Unit. If possible, include photos of special projects. If your Unit is not involved in this program, say so. That will serve as your report.
- March 15<sup>th</sup>: Submit Service to Veterans Hours Award form to recognize eligible members with Service to Veterans pins and hour bars.
- April 1<sup>st</sup>: Submit Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation Award Cover Sheet with narrative for judging as Most Outstanding Unit Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation Program to the Department Chairman.
- To be considered for a national award, the unit must submit their entry with a National Award Cover sheet to the Department Chairman. The National Award Cover sheet will be posted on the department website (<u>www.amlegionauxwi.org</u>).

This year, National President Lisa Williamson is trying to help raise awareness about the American Legion's Be the One campaign. Working as a family can make a better impact on this issue.

The No. 1 issue facing the veteran community is suicide, according to the **National Veteran Suicide Prevention Annual Report.** It is estimated that between 17 and 22 veterans or servicemembers take their lives each day. That's more than 6,000 annually. The rate of suicide for veterans is more than 50% higher than that of non-veteran adults. As the Global War on Terrorism continues, there will be more veterans facing mental-health issues such as post-traumatic stress disorder.

What will Be the One achieve?

At its core, The American Legion is activating a national platform to reduce the rate of veteran suicide. The Be the One campaign will:

- Destigmatize asking for mental health support, creating opportunity for those with mental health issues to speak freely and get the support they need.
- Provide peer-to-peer support and resources in local communities.
- Deploy FDA-approved therapeutics for veterans to identify issues and find resources for support.

I'm a spouse, partner, family member, caregiver, friend of a veteran, or interested civilian. What can I do to support this initiative?

The stigma associated with mental health issues is a barrier to veterans seeking assistance. They fear loss of their job, think they can handle their situation themselves, or don't believe others can understand their situation. Family members may be the first to recognize the signs that their loved one needs help, but they may lack the knowledge of how to approach the situation. If you have a family member, friend, business associate or have another connection with someone who is a veteran, The American Legion encourages you to Be the One to:

- Ask veterans in your life how they are doing.
- Listen when a veteran needs to talk.
- Reach out when a veteran is struggling.


