Third District—proudly representing Everglades National Park—is currently sitting 5th in the state of Wisconsin for membership!

We've reached 1,712 members toward our goal of 2,365, putting us at 72.39%. That's something to celebrate—but we're not done yet.

If each unit makes a focused push, we can move our district above 85% by next month. That means, collectively, we need to secure roughly 300 more renewals in the next few weeks. Together, that's absolutely within reach.
