A member who served as president for 1 full year, or a member who served as president for part of a year due to illness or conditions beyond their control and had to terminate their tenure. Any vice president acting as president due to the resignation or death of the president.*

The poppy, which symbolizes freedom and the blood sacrificed by troops during war, comes from the poem *In Flanders Fields*. Written by Canadian Lt. Col. John McCrae, the poem refers to the poppies that grew out of newly dug soldiers' graves during World War I in Europe.

Last year the Department of WI purchased 243,625 poppies, 84,100 poppies were purchased by other states, and the poppy dollars raised to support veterans was \$331,864.00. All this was made possible by 8 veterans who made all the poppies.

One poppy maker, who had problems with drugs and alcohol said making poppies took his mind off his issues. Instructing veterans how to make the poppies, who were going through similar issues, was his way of helping them get through the rough times. It is easier to talk with someone that is going through similar issues, than someone that is not.

He thanked God every time he completed a poppy because it gave him the opportunity to serve someone in his own way. It also filled up his time, so he didn't have to think about his demons. Making poppies gives another veteran a purpose, it fills the gap, not being able to maintain a job, making these poppies is a way for him to help his comrades.

Many veterans when asked why they enjoy making poppies, said it redirects their thoughts from themselves, knowing that what they make directly impacts the lives of other veterans. They feel wanted and included it helps keep them from being isolated. Veterans come to the Poppy Shop located at the Zablocki VA Medical Center in Milwaukee WI. There veteran poppy makers pick up kits and take them home and in their spare time make 1000 poppies. Each poppy has a label that states that this poppy was made by a veteran.

Because of dedicated work distributing poppies by units and their TAL family; many veterans benefit by the monies donated, but the hands that make the poppies feel honored to do so.

Next time you pick up a poppy take a good look at it, how perfectly the poppy is made, the crepe paper peddles so evenly together, all made to honor those who gave their all for us, so we have our freedoms; let us never forget.

Details such as the department chairmen's contact information, Program Engagement Plans, contest rules and deadlines, important dates, and resources for each program are now listed under the "Programs" tab.

2024 DUES RENEWAL NOTICES:



- Units should forward dues collected from members to department as soon as received.
- The national organization will mail a second renewal notice on February 1st to members whose dues are not processed by department by the end of December.
- The renewal notice will instruct members to remit their dues <u>directly</u> <u>to department</u>. Units will receive their portion of dues via direct deposit on a monthly basis.
- Units may want to personally contact each unpaid member as a friendly reminder or send them a dues renewal postcard to encourage them to pay their 2024 dues before they become delinquent. Postcards can be ordered from department using the Membership Supplies Order Form.

TAL MIDWINTER CONFERENCE – ALA SESSION: The American Legion Auxiliary is holding a training session at The American Legion's Midwinter Conference on January 20, 2024 at the La Crosse Center. Anyone interested in attending must register for the Midwinter Conference through The American Legion and is asked to sign up for the Auxiliary's session using the response sheet that was in the last unit mailing. Visit (www.wilegion.org) for details. Anyone attending the ALA's session is encouraged to bring socks and hygiene items for the Socks of Love and enough fleece to make a twin tie blanket (2.5 yards/side for a total of 5 yards of fabric) for veterans in need.

ALA BADGER GIRLS STATE (ALABGS): 2024 ALABGS reservations of \$400 per delegate are due January 31, 2024. Sponsors should contact their schools now and are encouraged to work with the high school through the selection process. Sponsors may also want to use the Memo of Understanding (MOU) that was included in the information packet they received in November. The MOU stipulates that parents will repay the sponsor if the delegate withdraws from the ALABGS program after the refund date of April 15th or does not complete the session. It is the sponsor's responsibility to enforce the MOU if they wish to recover any of the reservation fee.

Due to increasing costs, ALABGS is projected to have a deficit budget this year. All members should have received a letter requesting donations to offset the operating expenses. Please consider donating if you are able.

Volunteers are needed for the 2024 ALABGS Session. Anyone interested in helping for the week or even a few days should contact Chairman Danyelle Thompson at alabgs.chairman@gmail.com. A list of opportunities are posted at www.alabgs.org.

ANNUAL REPORTS: 2023-2024 Annual Report forms were mailed to all Unit Presidents in October and are posted on the department website in fillable format. As a reminder, reports are due April 15, 2024.

ALTERNATES TO NATIONAL CONVENTION: The 2024 National Convention will be held in New Orleans, LA from August 24-29, 2024. With the resolution passed at the 2023 National Convention, Wisconsin should be entitled to more delegates and alternate positions than in previous years. Members interested in serving as an alternate to national convention should contact their District President. Per Department Bylaws, the nomination selection process shall be determined at the discretion of the district, possibly at their spring or fall conferences, or by executive action. Names of nominees shall be sent to Department Headquarters as soon as selected and no later than July 1st.

The successful candidate will be appointed to serve a 3-year term (July 2024-July 2027).

Americanism Essay Criteria and Rubric

35 Points- Theme Development: This would involve answering the who, what, where, when and why about the theme. Essays should relate to the writer's personal experiences.

35 Points- Clarity of Ideas: Essays should have an easy to understand format or organization with correct spelling and grammar usage. The ideas or points are clearly expressed. The reader should have a clear understanding of the writer's explanation of the theme.

30 Points- Knowledge or Understanding of the Question: The writer shows an understanding of the key words in the question. (This assists the writer with the task of staying on the topic or the question.)

SCORING RUBRIC

35 Points- Theme Development:

- 25 Points- The writer answers the who, what, where, when and why about them.
- 10 Points- The writer provides personal experiences that relate to the topic.

35 Points- Clarity of Ideas:

- 25 Points- The essays should have an easy to understand format or organization so that the reader understands the writer's explanation of the theme. The ideas or points are clearly expressed.
 - * Grades 5 and up should have an introduction, smooth transitions between ideas and a conclusion.
- 5 Points- The writer uses correct spelling.
- 5 Points-The writer uses correct grammar.

30 Points- Knowledge or Understanding of the Question:

• 30 Points- The writer shows an understanding of the key words in the question. (This assists the writer with the task of staying on the topic or question.)

My focus for this article is the American Legion's Child Welfare Foundation (CWF). When I posted the \$1 challenge to all 12 Districts, I never imagined how many would respond so quickly to this statewide challenge.

There was much confusion on when and where to send the donations, however if you want to receive a CWF banner to hang in your Post, each member of your Unit (the number is based upon the official membership total from the National Organization as of June 1, 2024), send the donation along with the banner request form (included in this mailing) to the address on the banner form, otherwise, collect what you can and send one check to Department.

Make sure you declare your donation on the 2023-2024 General Fund Suggested Donations form. Please send me a copy of your donation form so that I can track it for Department Convention. As of November 15, 2023, Wisconsin had 11,500 paid members – think of the impact this could make in the lives of our youths.

Another way you can impact a child's life is through the Youth Hero and Good Deed Awards (online nomination form can be accessed from the Department website, under the Programs tab/Children & Youth button). Youths receiving these awards do not need to be associated with the military. They just need to be kids who are doing something special in their communities.

Some ideas on how to find these deserving youths:

- 1. Watch or read the news.
- 2. Go online and google youth heroes in your area.
- 3. Send inquiry letters to churches, schools, fire departments, police stations or newspapers.
- 4. Make up a letter or flyer and give it to your Juniors to give to the teachers or leaders of other programs they might be involved in.
- 5. When distributing poppies, have a poster visible for the public to see that you are looking for youth heroes and you might be surprised about what they might tell you.

BE THE ONE to recognize youth this year. If you see a special youth in another community, you can recognize them also. There might not be a Unit in that community, but don't let the opportunity pass to show appreciation.

I ask that you all pray for our youths, that they will remain safe and be encouraged to always do the right thing, and they will have the strength and knowledge they need during a time when their heroism might be needed.

- 1. All senior members of the Wisconsin American Legion Auxiliary, holding 2024 membership card are eligible to enter the tournament under the below rules.
- 2. New bowlers enter the tournament with an average of 145 women and 165 men.
- 3. Entrants allowed bowling only once per event.
- 4. Everyone MUST bowl when scheduled.

- 6. No entries shall be accepted after the entry closing date. NO EXCEPTIONS
- 7. All events are optional and may be entered for a \$3.00 fee. Paid all events are not transferable unless the substitute replaces original entrant in all three events.
- 8. If a team has only 3 bowlers, only 3 scores can be used. NO blind score will be used.
- 9. This tournament will be conducted on a handicap basis of 75% of the difference between each entrant's average and 200 pins.
- 10. If a substitution is made in the doubles event the substitute must take the place of the bowler she is replacing. NO rearranging of partners will be permitted in the doubles.
- 11. A sub shall be allowed, if one is available, in case of disability after a game has started, in team and doubles only. Only the actual score of the frames bowled shall count if a sub is not available.
- 12. Bowlers entered in all three events will be so scheduled to permit them to complete competition within two days, unless they are doubled with someone who is bowling on another four-person team at some other time, which prevents scheduling of these participants on same convenient dates.
- 13. Teams will bowl all three games on their scheduled pair of lanes. Doubles and Singles events with be bowled on another pair of lanes.
- 14. Every bowler entered in the individual events must have at least one ball for their personal use. No sharing balls with other bowlers. (House balls are acceptable.)
- 15. If a bowler is absent by the scheduled time and does not arrive by the end of the 4th frame of the 1st game, absent bowler shall forfeit the first game, but is eligible to bowl 2nd and 3rd game if arrival prior to the start of the 2nd game.
- 16. First place Champions and last place Champions will receive individual certificates and pins.
- 17. Cash prizes will be determined upon completion of tournament, based on funds received.
- 18. NO SMOKING OR DRINKING WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE BOWLERS SEATING AREA.
- 19. Make sure you are watching for your turn to bowl and keep the games going. There are other shifts for Auxiliary bowling and possible league bowling scheduled after our tournament.

CAPTAINS

- 1. Captains must check in and verify lineups 45 minutes prior to starting time. Registration will CLOSE 30 minutes before squad time. This is all necessary due to last minute changes. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.
- 2. When <u>substitutes not registered on entry blank are used</u>, captains shall report same to Tournament Manager before entering contest and present 2024 American Legion Auxiliary membership card of substitute.
- 3. There must be a TEAM CAPTAIN FOR EACH TEAM.

Service to Veteran pins are awarded as such: upon reaching 50 hours you will receive a Service to Veterans pin. After that, attachable hour bars are awarded for 100, 300, 500, and 1,000 hours. After reaching 1,000 hours, the award increments are increased by 1,000 (i.e., 2,000; 3,000; 4,000 up to 20,000 hours). After 20,000 hours, increments increase to 5,000 hours (i.e., 25,000; 30,000; 35,000). A Lifetime Service to Veterans pin is awarded after 35,000 hours. It is very important to report hours every year as hours accrue so the appropriate award can be distributed.

Note: In 2021-2022 reportable hours allowed for caregivers of veteran family members was changed IF the caregiver does not receive professional compensation for doing so:

➤ If you are a caregiver of a veteran who lives with you, you may claim 10 hours per week.

➤ If you are a caregiver of a veteran who does not live with you (i.e., nursing home), you may claim 5 hours per week.

EXAMPLES OF COUNTABLE VOLUNTEER SERVICE TO VETERANS HOURS

Service to Veterans is volunteer service that directly benefits a veteran outside a VA facility. These hours should not be reported under any other program (i.e., Community Service, National Security, etc.). Some examples of qualifying service are listed below:

- Help elderly veterans at home (cleaning, yard work, etc.)
- Provide transportation for a veteran
- Offer to run errands for a caregiver or sit with a veteran while the caregiver runs errands
- Assist with veterans' job fairs by organizing or working at an informational table
- Volunteer at Camp American Legion
- Donate/Raise money for the Veterans Creative Arts Festival
- Volunteer for the Veterans Creative Arts Festival

- Make tray favors for veterans in nursing homes on patriotic holidays
- Give gifts and cards to veterans in nursing homes
- Make tie blankets or afghans for veterans
- Make Quilts of Valor
- Create and donate items from VA&R pattern book
- Shop for and prepare care packages for home-bound veterans
- Buy school supplies, host a baby shower, or send care packages to veterans' children who are headed to college
