* 2026 Spring Conference Elections: The ALA Eleventh District Constitution (Article IV, Section 1) states that a District President, First Vice President, Second Vice President, and Treasurer be elected biennially in the even number years. The District Secretary, Chaplain, Parliamentarian, and Sergeant-at-Arms are appointed positions. Article IV, Section 2 states that the District President and Vice Presidents shall NOT serve for two (2) successive terms in the same capacity. This means that our very capable Treasurer, Janet Ericksen, may continue in that capacity if she is willing and is elected. The positions of President and Vice presidents will need to be filled in April. District Eleven is blessed with very capable members to fill these positions. We are all here to help each other out.
