2022-2023 AUXILIARY EMERGENCY FUND PROGRAM ACTION PLAN

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The Auxiliary Emergency Fund (AEF) is a national grant assistance program that provides temporary emergency assistance to eligible members of the American Legion Auxiliary who have endured a significant financial setback as the result of an act of nature or another personal crisis.

Established in 1969, the AEF was created with a bequest from the estate of Auxiliary member Helen Colby Small of Burlington, Wisconsin. Five decades later, the AEF is still helping fellow Auxiliary members get back on their feet. In order to carry on the Auxiliary Emergency Fund, we need your generous support.

Eligibility: Members of the American Legion Auxiliary whose dues are current and who have maintained membership for three consecutive years (the current year and immediate past two years), who have not received a grant (of the same type they are applying for) within the last 12 months, and are applying within six months of the disaster are eligible to apply for a Disaster Assistance grant or a Temporary Assistance grant when:

- A financial crisis hits, leaving a member without resources to pay rent/mortgage and/or utilities, and no other source of aid is readily available.
- A natural disaster or weather emergency leaves a member with a damaged or destroyed primary residence and/or significant emergency expenses (lodging, food, fuel, supplies, etc.), and no other source of aid is readily available.

What Can You Do:

- Each unit should have an active Auxiliary Emergency Fund chairman/committee.
- Familiarize yourself and your unit members with the Auxiliary Emergency Fund. Knowing about this program will make the process easier and increase the chances of the applicants receiving a grant, should you need to help a member apply.
- Learn the application process, what kind of documents to include with applications, fund restrictions, and help members in need contact other organizations that might be able to assist them.
- Have printed applications and AEF brochures available during unit meetings and at the local post.
- Host fundraisers and donate proceeds to the National Auxiliary Emergency Fund.
- Make a personal donation to the AEF.

Year-End Reports

Each unit Auxiliary Emergency Fund (AEF) chairman is required to submit a narrative report by April 15, 2022 to department headquarters, who will then forward it to the department AEF chairman.

As part of your narrative report, please include answers to the following questions:

- * Does your unit promote the Auxiliary Emergency Fund at meetings and events?
- * How much did your unit donate to the Auxiliary Emergency Fund?
- * Were there any applications for help from your Unit?
- * Describe your Unit's fundraising ideas.
