## **Draping the Charter**

When a Unit is, deprived of one of its members by death, it is customary to drape the Unit charter with black crepe during the period of mourning. The following ceremony is suggested for the draping of the charter.

**Unit President:** "We have assembled here at the call of our Maker who has taken from us one of our beloved leaders. We have come to give, by simple token, an official expression of the grief of the Unit of. Let us first bow our heads in prayer."

**Chaplain:** (Brief prayer) "Almighty God, who has dominion over life and death, grant to us the grace to remember with love and reverence our valiant and honored departed Member (members name.)

(Members). Grant peace and eternal rest to those who have gone before us and make us ready for that last hour. Strengthen and console those in sorrow and bestow upon us Your everlasting blessing. Amen."

**Unit President:** "We stand before the document which gives our Unit life and being. Under its authority years of devoted service given by (members name.) who contributed to its significance, whose service has ended but the results will go on and on for our American Legion Auxiliary and for God and the country which the Auxiliary serves.

It is therefore fitting that about our charter we should drape this crepe of black, an expression of the sorrow that is in our hearts and of the mourning of the Unit of over its great loss." (Drape the charter)

The Wisconsin Army National Guard created camp to help alleviate deployment anxiety. Most attendees are Guard children, but all branches are welcome. Camp Lakotah in Wautoma, WI, embraces ages 8 to 17, offering a variety of fun activities in a safe atmosphere.

In 2023, S.A.L.'s participation, (now annual) involved two 90-minute patriotic sessions: Betsy Ross tells the American flag story, *That Old Rugged Flag*, flag etiquette, Pledge of Allegiance and national anthem recitation/discussion, story/playing of TAPS, flag-folding with all children participating, flag retirement explanation/procedure, and Q&A with Veterans!

Arrival: Wednesday afternoon/evening - Sunday morning/afternoon pickup. The cost is \$250 per child, but no one is turned away. Goals: Fill camp to capacity (160), increase funding and extend to a full 5-day week, and create another camp for easier accessibility, while increasing campers.

It's the beginning of a new administrative year for us so here are a few questions for you to consider as you begin preparing for another year of service to our veterans and our organization.

Do you like order? Do you like things running smoothly? Do you like to avoid procedural problems?

If you answered yes to any or all of these questions, it might be time to take a look at your Constitution & Bylaws to see if everything is in good order. There have been many changes and updates to both the National and Department documents over the last few years that essentially affect how we function.

Since we are at the beginning of our Auxiliary year, it would be a great time to begin reviewing your governing documents. The process is not nearly as complicated as some make it appear, a committee of 3 to 5 members should be more than enough to tackle the job.

Begin by reading the Department Constitution & Bylaws to be sure you are aware of the latest updates. Next, get out your governing documents. Read them through once, then go back and read them again. This time, have a highlighter or pen and paper handy. Note any questions you may have, any items where you are not really sure of the meaning or intent, and any areas that you just aren't sure why they are there. Discuss the observations with your committee and then begin re-writing those sections that need updating.

If you still need more inspiration, guidance, direction, advice, support or just plain help, there is a template available for you to follow that will provide the proper format and structure for the most important documents your unit will ever have. Please feel free to email this chairman for a copy and any further information you might need to get those documents in good order.

Once your review is complete, discuss any proposed changes with your members. After all changes are added and the document is approved by your members, remember to email the revised document to this Department Chairman. Your document will be reviewed for compliance with the National and Department documents and a copy added to your unit's file at department headquarters.

Remember, up-to-date documents will keep your unit in order and running smoothly!

The American Legion Auxiliary Education program aims to provide educational opportunities for children and adults. Elementary and high school students have access to materials promoting many levels of learning. Scholarships are available at the National and Department levels for traditional and non-traditional students.

To this end the M. Louise Wilson Loan Fund provides interest-free loans of \$800 a year and can be renewed for up to five years. All loans must be signed by a responsible party usually a parent or guardian. Repayment begins with payments of not less than \$50 a month starting within six months after the grantee graduates or ceases to be a student. Membership in the American Legion Auxiliary must continue until the loan is paid in full. Units are encouraged to donate to the M. Louise Wilson Loan Fund and this helps ALA members with their educational goals.

Are you the past leader who doesn't know she's a bully? You love the organization, you love what we do, you love our mission, but are people staying away from the meetings because you're dominating all the conversations?

You could be keeping ALA members from attending meetings because you are being a bully, which hurts the mission as well as the growth of the organization.

Are you the first one to speak up, and continue to speak up, when there is discussion on the floor? Do you dominate and intimidate others and leave them with the impression of, 'do as I say or you'll never get anywhere in this organization?'

Are you using your influence as a past leader in your unit or department to convince others that your way is the only way? Are you the one making the phone calls trying to sway other members to your way of thinking? Do you constantly criticize the actions of other members?

Are you mentoring in the wrong direction?

Ann Carlsen, founder and CEO of Carlsen Resources, a provider of executive search and consulting services for media and telecommunications businesses, stated in a recent article entitled, *Taking the Bully by the Horns*, that bullying is the opposite of dealing fairly with others. Carlsen states it may be defined as "repeated acts or comments that are not constructive and hurt or isolate a person in the workplace."

Although Carlsen's article speaks mainly to those in the workplace, her statement clearly applies to any area where a group of people are working together for a common goal.

The duties of a Parliamentarian are to Assist the Presiding Officer in managing meetings and advising on parliamentary procedures. To provide guidance and assistance in applying the "Rules of Order' for meetings. These rules, according to our Governing Documents and Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised, enable groups to efficiently and fairly discuss and determine actions to be taken.

#### How to be an effective Parliamentarian:

- They should sit beside the Presiding Officer during the meetings and advise them on matters of parliamentary procedure when asked.
- If possible, review the meeting Agenda with the Presiding Officer to be familiar with the business and possible problems that may arise.
- Have important parliamentary resources, like Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised and the organizations Constitution, ByLaws and Standing Rules readily available for reference. Know the rules of the organization.
- Work with members to educate them in parliamentary procedures. Give guidance in their roles as Officers or Chairpersons to further develop their knowledge and skills.


To efficiently run a meeting there should always be an Agenda, the Agenda is a list or outline of things to be considered during the meeting. It is the order in which business will be conducted for this meeting – giving the attendees knowledge of what is to be presented.

The Presiding Officer should ask at the beginning of the meeting if there are any additions or corrections to the agenda. The agenda can be changed with a member making a motion, having a second, discussion and voting on the motion.
